



Load Securing for Radioactive Materials Training

Course Description

This course is designed to provide participants with information relating to the transportation of goods in commerce and the requirements for properly securing loads. The instructors have extensive experience in the transport industry. Course participants have the opportunity to use current copies of applicable regulations and gain familiarity with those regulations. The emphasis of this course is to provide shipping personnel guidance in implementation of and compliance with FMCSR as identified in 49 CFR Part 392 and 393.

Materials Provided

Each participant receives the latest copy of the Regulations, Federal Motor Carrier (FMCSR) Student Manual, supplemental handouts, certificate of completion, and other classroom materials.

Examination

Successful completion is achieved with a passing score of 80% or better on the comprehensive exam.

Record Keeping

Successful participants receive a certificate stating that they completed the course. Original tests and certificates will be returned to the individual for on-site record keeping.

Any person responsible for loading and securing cargo for transport.
